Applications will be reviewed three times per year with application deadlines 20 November 2012, 20 January 2013, and 20 March 2013. Awards notification will be sent to Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid and to the student with the award letter noting that the award is subject to additional verification that they meet the First Generation and Need requirements.

Students must be US Citizen or Green Card holders and fill out the on-line FAFSA and Georgia Tech Scholarship and Financial Aid Form (GTAPP) (Both available at finaid.gatech.edu).

Students are strongly encouraged to have direct deposit set up through the Bursar's Office.
